Must teach introductory and upper-level courses in Africana Studies, supervise undergraduate independent study projects in Africana Studies, and contribute to the College's First Year Seminar. Ability to teach in one or more other interdisciplinary programs (e.g., Women, Gender, and Sexuality Studies, Queer Studies, Latin American Studies, or Global and International Studies) especially desirable. Ph.D. required. The College of Wooster enrolls a diverse student body (21% domestic students of color and 15% international students); applicants should have experience with diverse student populations.

Application Procedures: Applicants should submit a letter of application, curriculum vitae, teaching statement, research statement, a diversity statement, unofficial graduate transcripts, and three letters of recommendation. The diversity statement should detail how the applicant has engaged and/or expects to engage with issues of diversity in the classroom and the curriculum, as well as on campus and in the broader community.
