Qualifications: The Department of Public and Community Service Studies and the Black Studies Program at Providence College invites applications for a full-time joint tenure-track assistant professor position beginning August 2020. The successful candidate must show evidence of potential for excellence in teaching and publication in the area of Black feminisms, class and inequality, and critical pedagogy, with particular expertise in social movements, social identities, and feminist approaches to community-engaged research and organizing, particularly around the intersection of race and class. As our student body, and Public and Community Service majors and Black Studies minors in particular, grow increasingly diverse, we have a strong preference for publicly engaged scholarship, and candidates with interests in and evidence of student-centered pedagogical and mentoring practices. Moreover, as students of color and their allies have demanded in college and university protests across the nation, we support the students' desire to hire faculty who demonstrate a deep commitment to and proven ability in supporting the success of students from historically marginalized economic, social, and cultural groups. The course load is 3-3 with the option for a one semester pre-tenure research leave after three years of service as a member of the Ordinary Faculty. A Ph.D. in related fields appropriate to a joint appointment in Public and Community Service and Black Studies is required and

applicants must have dissertation in hand at the time of appointment.
