academic appointment beginning the Fall 2020 semester. The successful candidate will be expected to teach 4 courses per semester (fall and spring), including two sections of Introduction to Africana Studies, which explores Africa's foundational relationship to and connections with its diaspora in the USA, Europe, Latin America and the Caribbean, and two additional courses in their specialty areas. The successful candidate will be expected to adhere to core curriculum requirements and other curricular expectations when teaching courses with these designations. This position is predominantly a teaching role, with minimal service and no research expectations. The Africana Studies Program is part of Interdisciplinary Critical Studies unit, which is comprised of Africana Studies, Film Studies, Latino/a and Mexican American Studies, Religious Studies, and Women's and Gender Studies.
