We welcome applicants who conduct research in any area of African American and African Diasporic studies; preference will be given to candidates with a PhD or equivalent terminal degree with expertise in African American and/or African Diaspora Studies and related fields. Teaching experience is preferred. Candidates must demonstrate potential for excellence as a scholar-teacher, and publication of scholarly research is desirable. Candidate must hold or anticipate PhD or equivalent terminal degree by start date of August 1, 2021. Position is available August 2021 pending final budgetary approval. UNCG is a Minority Serving Institution (MSI), with an undergraduate student body in 2020 consisting of 47% ethnic and minority students, and we seek an appropriately diverse applicant pool for this position.
