



## **ETHNIC STUDIES DEPARTMENT PART-TIME LECTURER POSITIONS**

The Ethnic Studies Department at the University of California, Riverside, invites applications for part-time lecturer positions for the Fall 2022 and Spring 2023 quarters. Fall 2022 quarter begins September 19, 2022 and ends December 9, 2022. Spring 2023 quarter begins March 29, 2023 and ends June 16, 2023.

Salary: \$7,146 per course (pending final budget approval).

### Qualifications:

A completed M.A. in Ethnic Studies, African/African American Studies, Ethnic Studies/American Studies, Art History, History, Law, Political Science, Anthropology, Sociology, Psychology, Economics, Ethnomusicology, Public Health, Education, Public Affairs, Urban Planning, Philosophy, Theater, Film, Literature, Humanities, Gender Studies, LGBTQ Studies, or related fields are encouraged to apply. Candidates with a minimum of two years of teaching experience and a demonstrated record of distinguished undergraduate teaching is required. Priority will be given to candidates with a demonstrated commitment to excellence in teaching Ethnic Studies and who are knowledgeable in the area(s) of: Africana-Studies, Black/Afro-American Studies, or Black Diaspora Studies. In addition, preference will be given to internal prior Pre-Six candidates.

Provide a cover letter that specifies your qualifications for each position you are applying for, a sample syllabus for the class you wish to teach, curriculum vitae, Statement of Teaching, Statement of Contributions to Diversity, recent teaching evaluations taught at the college or university level, and 3 letters of reference that assess teaching ability. Materials should be uploaded using UCR's on-line application system.

Review of applications will begin on September 8, 2022 and may continue until filled. To ensure full consideration, applications and supporting material should be received by September 8, 2022.
