Institution is Seeking: The History Department and the Africana Studies Program at Tulane University invite applications for a tenure-line faculty position at the rank of Assistant, Associate or Full Professor in Modern African American History (post-1865). The field of research is open, teaching experience preferred. Appointments would begin July 1, 2023. The successful candidate will have a tenure home in the History Department and a joint appointment in the Africana Studies Program, with teaching and service divided equally between the two units. Tulane's Africana Studies Program is comprised of both joint and affiliate faculty committed to the interdisciplinary and global study of Africa and its diasporas. Most courses will be cross-listed. We are committed to creating an intellectually diverse, inclusive, and equitable institution, and we especially encourage candidates from historically underrepresented groups to apply. Review of applications will begin on October 15, 2022, and continue until position is filled or search is closed.

Qualifications: Candidates must complete all requirements for the Ph.D. by 1 June 2023.

Application Procedures: Applicants' dossiers should include a letter of application, C.V. and an article-length writing sample. Assistant-level and untenured applicants should submit three letters of reference via Interfolio; currently tenured applicants should submit the names of three references who may be asked to provide letters of reference on request.
