

The Department of African American Studies at Northwestern University invites applications for a full-time, two-year Postdoctoral Fellowship with a start date of September 1, 2023. Candidates with PhDs granted between 2021 and the start date are encouraged to apply. Candidates can be from any (inter-)discipline, but should have a commitment to the field of Black Studies, and have a research and teaching profile in Black digital life, Blackness and technology, Black visual cultures, Black popular culture, or Black music. This is a residential fellowship. The candidate will teach two quarter-long courses in the Department per year, and participate in the intellectual life of the Department and University. Review of applications submitted electronically to the link on our webpage at <https://afam.northwestern.edu/> will begin on November 7, 2022.
