Institution is Seeking: The African American Studies Program at the University of Florida, College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, invites applications for a full-time, nine-month tenure track position at the level of Assistant/Advanced Assistant Professor to begin August 16, 2023. Specialization: 20th Century African American History. The new faculty member will play a central role in moving the current program in African American Studies towards departmental status. We are, therefore, seeking a candidate who has experience in curriculum and departmental development. The African American Studies Program seeks to hire faculty broadly engaged in research that is field-bridging, and which will add to our program's intellectual diversity, as well as better reflect the interests of our undergraduate students.

Qualifications: A Ph.D. in African American Studies is preferred, or a terminal degree in a related field. The successful applicant will demonstrate a commitment to the African American Studies program's mission and values. For this tenure-track position, we are particularly interested in candidates who combine rigorous and original scholarship, with community engagement.

Application Procedures: Successful applicants are expected to teach two courses per fall and two courses per spring semester, with a mix of introductory and advanced undergraduate courses. The ability to develop experiential learning opportunities for undergraduates and excel in mentoring undergraduate research and experience in developing a department. Salary is competitive and commensurate with qualifications and experience, and the compensation includes a full benefits package.
