Institution is Seeking: The History Department at the University of Texas at El Paso invites applications for an Assistant Professor of History focusing on early America to 1800 with possible strengths in African or Indigenous populations, women and gender, or ties to the Spanish Colonies or the Atlantic World, to begin in the fall of 2023. The successful candidate should be able to teach courses on the Colonial and Revolutionary Eras of the United States and should have a robust research agenda that makes productive connections with Borderlands or Atlantic World History that will strengthen our PhD program. The department is known internationally for its doctoral program in Borderlands history. This program, which has about 35 students, capitalizes on our location on the U.S.-Mexico border, and encompasses both conceptual and comparative borderlands in global context. Salary is competitive and commensurate with qualifications and experience. Preferred but not required: A scholar involved with public-facing scholarship and digital humanities.

Qualifications: Requirements: A Ph.D. in history or closely related field is required at the time of appointment. Additional Information: Hiring decisions are based on budget approval. The search committee is especially interested in candidates who through their research, teaching, and service, will contribute to UTEP's inclusive excellence framework.
