Applicants must provide the name and contact information of three references. In later phases of the search process, applicants may be requested to submit a writing sample, and verification of terminal degrees, licenses and certificates. At time of appointment, the successful candidate, if not a U.S. citizen, must have authorization from the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) to work in the United States.
